2nd BSEC Month of Culture 1-30 November 2018

The International Centre for Black Sea Studies (ICBSS) launched its 2nd BSEC Month of Culture on Thursday 1 November 2018 and will run online until 30 November 2018.

The first week of the event began with a video story about Azerbaijan, currently holding the BSEC Chairmanship-in-Office, and continued with short stories and videos highlighting monuments and natural sights of Georgia, Bulgaria, Armenia and Serbia; popular gastronomy from Albania, Azerbaijan, Moldova and Greece; traditional Albanian, contemporary Ukrainian and classic Russian music; literature masterpieces of Armenian and Georgian writers; performance art from Serbia and Turkey; Ukrainian painting and Romanian sculpting; as well as the opening of the international film festival in Greece.

The 2nd BSEC Month of Culture continues until 30 November 2018, with more trivia and videos, as well as with online quizzes on the cultural heritage of the 12 BSEC Member States: Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bulgaria, Georgia, Greece, Moldova, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Turkey, and Ukraine.
