GEORGIA

Grigol Robakidze (October 1880 - November 1962) is the first Georgian writer, publicist who was nominated for the Nobel Prize in Literature. He is known for his prose and anti-Soviet émigré activities. In 1915, Robakidze founded and led a new group of symbolists and poets, *Blue Horns*, by which he won the respect of important European figures such as Stefan Zweig and Nikos Kazantzakis.
