









What is the SSF University?

- The "SSF University" stems from recommendations within the Regional Plan of Action for Small-Scale Fisheries in the Mediterranean and the Black Sea (RPOA-SSF) on the need for capacity building initiatives for small-scale fishers in the Mediterranean and Black Sea region.
- Objectives:
 - Share knowledge on select topics
 - Promote best practices
 - Facilitate learning exchanges among fishers in the region





• WHAT: a series of workshops and training courses for small-scale fisheries stakeholders in line with the main topics of the RPOA-SSF

• WHO: small-scale fishers and fish-workers active in the sector are encouraged to participate

 HOW: the structure of each workshop varies and may consist of classroom learning, in the field experience and peer-to-peer exchanges






LAUNCH OF THE SSF UNIVERSITY

Small-scale fishers are the first guardians of the sea. At the SSF University, they will exchange best practices with fishers from across the region and they will learn how they can productively engage in decisionmaking processes ³³

 - Other courses postponed to 2021




