Cultural and Creative Regional Ecosystems

The richness of Cultural Heritage and the vibrancy of Cultural and Creative Industries (CCIs) in Europe have had an increasing impact in both economic and social terms, across the EU as well as in national contexts. CCIs contribute to the economy with 5.3% of the total European GVA (Gross Value Added) and employs more than 12 million people in the EU, which is 7.5% of all persons employed in the total economy (1).

- ✓ Creative entrepreneurs
- ✓ Cultural heritage professionals
- ✓ Cultural & Creative intermediaries and managers
- ✓ Publisher professionals and professionals of the audio-visual sector
- CCIs are in a strategic position to trigger spillover effects in other industries. Culture and creativity have a direct impact on sectors such as Tourism and are integrated at all stages of the value chain of other sectors such as Food, Fashion and High-End industries.




